Rio Electrico Valley (Cover image): "This viewpoint of Monte Fitz Roy (far left) was our reward during a six-mile (round-trip) hike from El Chalten, Chile - Patagonia. The blue, jagged Piedras Blancas Glacier descends from the Fitz Roy massif. At the glacier's base is a turquoise meltwater lake."

Symmetry: "The winds are a constant companion in Patagonia. This particular morning was an exception - no wind, still water."

Horns & Towers: "The early morning sun filtered through the drifting clouds, casting a warm glow to the horn-like 'Los Cuernos' spires as well as the 'Torres' (Towers) in the distance. These two features dominate the landscape within the Torres del Paine National Park in Chile."

Glowing Fitz Roy: "At 11,168' in elevation, Monte Fitz Roy is sought after by photographers the world-over. It's located outside the small town of El Chalten within the region of Patagonia, Argentina. An early wake-up call allowed us to arrive in time for sunrise."

Los Cuernos: "Located within Patagonia's famed Torres del Paine National Park in Chile is this stunning vertical outcrop of banded granite and sedimentary rock. Their shape gives rise to their name, Los Cuernos (The Horns)."

These are his comments:

Buck in Bushes: "...taken along a hiking trail in Wingate Prairie, Veteran Acres Park. The prairie is an Illinois Nature Preserve. The trail begins at the Nature Center at Veteran Acres, winds through the woods and a steep hollow, then back up to the prairie, to a fork in the trail. I went straight ahead (roughly east). On the left side of the trail is the prairie. On the right side is a thicket of brush and woods. That's where I saw several deer, including the subject of the photo."

Pussy Willow: "...taken at Shamrock Hills Park, 6204 Hillside Road, Crystal Lake the Crystal Lake (on Hillside, just east of Walkup). This was a donated property that once was a private meeting center. It has several ponds, and some parts are very landscaped. The pussy willows are part of the original landscaping."

Montreal Sunrise with Wheel & Dome: "... taken in Montreal at 5:00 a.m., from my hotel window. The geodesic dome was originally built in the 1960's for the Montreal World's Fair (Expo 67). Today it is a museum dedicated to the environment and environmental issues."



These are Jeff's comments:

"All images were taken in the very early morning, just at or before sunrise, which is always the best time of day (but not so easy when the sun rises around 5:20). The last two images are a before and after. The fog layer and muted light was interesting but I decided to play around with different skies. I have accumulated a library of my own skies but may also use online skies. I often use Luminar Neo software to place a sky after working up the initial RAW file through Adobe Raw and Photoshop. For me, the end justifies the means. My goal has always been the production of best image possible. I am not a big fan of adding objects, etc... but never shy away from changing a sky, especially if it is one of my own. Manipulating a photo goes way back to the great photographers such as Ansel Adams. He would spend days working on one image but did not have the luxury of modern technology. His work

was done with burning, dodging and contrast manipulations. So, is this much different than what we do now? The "purest" photographers may balk at digital manipulations but if it is done well, again, the end may justify the means."


