




Open House Chicago

Every October, the Chicago Architecture Center (CAC) hosts **Open House** Chicago - a free public festival that offers self-guided history and architecture trails throughout Chicago, talks and programming, and behind-the-scenes access to architecturally, historically and culturally significant sites across the city.

Open House Chicago (OHC) is one of the largest events of its kind in the world. This year's in-person site visits occur on October 19 - 20, with extended programming and city-wide self-guided tours available for the

entire month of October.

When you participate in the in-person site visits on October 19-20, there are CAC docents and volunteers to guide you into most places. Some sites are places that are not usually open to the public, such as the Cliff Dwellers Club, which offers spectacular views of Lake Michigan and Millennium Park. Other sites, that usually require an entrance fee, have free access. It is a great way to get unusual views of the city, its architecture and stunning, rarely seen spaces.






SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS FOR PHOTO EDITING

Another in the series of notes from the presentation by Peter J. Pelke II at the August 13, 2024 meeting. Peter Used Photoshop Elements 2024.

REFINE EDGE



In Photoshop Elements, you can fine-tune your selection using the Refine Edge dialog box (select a portion of an image, right-click the selection, and choose Refine Edge from the context menu). You can also open the Refine Edge dialog by choosing Select > Refine Edge.

To open the Refine Edge dialog on a Mac, select a portion of an image, Command-click the selection, and choose Refine Edge.

- **View Mode.** From the View pop-out menu, choose a view mode for your selection. Press F to cycle through the modes
- Show Radius. Displays the radius of the edge refinement.
- Refine Radius and Erase Refinements tools. Precisely adjust the border area in which edge refinement occurs. To quickly toggle from one tool to the other, press E. To change the brush size, press the bracket keys. Note: Brush over soft areas such as hair or fur, to add fine details to the selection.
- **Smart Radius.** Automatically adjusts the radius for hard and soft edges found in the border region. Deselect this option if the border is uniformly hard- or soft-edged, or if you want to control the Radius setting and refinement brushes more precisely.

(Software Solutions, continued)

• **Radius.** Determines the size of the selection border in which edge refinement occurs. Use a small radius for sharp edges, and a large one for softer edges.

- **Smooth.** Reduces irregular areas ("hills and valleys") in the selection border to create a smoother outline.
- **Feather.** Blurs the transition between the selection and surrounding pixels.
- **Contrast.** When increased, soft-edged transitions along the selection border become more abrupt. Typically, the Smart Radius option and refinement tools are more effective.
- **Shift Edge.** Moves soft-edged borders inward with negative values or outward with positive ones. Shifting these borders inward can help remove unwanted background colors from selection edges.
- **Decontaminate Colors**. Replaces color fringes with the color of fully selected pixels nearby. The strength of color replacement is proportionate to the softness of selection edges.

Important: Because this option changes pixel color, it requires output to a new layer or document. Retain the original layer so you can revert back to it if needed. (To easily see changes in pixel color, choose Reveal Layer for the View Mode.)

- Amount. Changes the level of decontamination and fringe replacement.
- **Output To.** Determines whether the refined selection becomes a selection or mask on the current layer or produces a new layer or document.

The Use Of AI - For Thought and Discussion

Editor's Note: This was submitted by CLCC member Sandy Wittman. What do you think? Perhaps we can share our thoughts at the next meeting. Sandy said:

My friend Harriet Feagin lives in the Texas Panhandle, and we often travel together to photograph. She posted the following on Facebook this week. I thought it might be of interest and certainly is a subject for discussion. Harriet gave me permission to send this to you.



I am seeing lovely works like this for sale. In and of itself, there's nothing wrong with selling art. Let me tell you about this piece. It is Al. I toyed around with a free program and produced this through verbal prompt in less than 30 seconds. It didn't require that I even get up out of my chair, much less do anything other than state what I wanted. Photographers are doing more with digital art but their photo is the foundation for these pieces of art. Photographers work hard to be at the right place at the right time, and it is far from easy. The ethical thing to do is state "Al" if you are going to sell prints to people. The buyer has a right to know.



The program she used was a free trial of Adobe Dreamweaver. She said that this picture is very small. If you want something bigger, you have to buy the program. The terms she used were sailboat, lake, moonlight, mountains.

<u>Adobe Dreamweaver</u> is a proprietary web development tool from Adobe. It was created by Macromedia in 1997 and developed by them until Macromedia was acquired by Adobe Systems in 2005. Adobe Dreamweaver is available for the macOS and Windows operating systems.

Morton Arboretum Sculpture Show

Of the Earth

The exhibition will run through spring 2025.

Five large-scale sculptures by Polish American artist Olga Ziemska will be created exclusively for a new exhibition at The Morton Arboretum, **Of the Earth**.

The exhibition will explore the artist's expression and philosophy that, she says, "We are nature." Ziemska said that her aim is to remind people that "everything in life is derived from the same basic elements that form everything in nature, including ourselves. There is no separation." In Polish, Ziemska means "of the earth."

The artist's work will be created from reclaimed tree branches and other natural materials gathered from various locations throughout the Arboretum's 1,700 acres. "I am giving reclaimed natural materials a new life and transforming them from nature into new forms," Ziemska said.
