



## SHOWN AT THE AUGUST MEETING





This is a *Before & After* pair by Rich Bickham called **Spacetime 2**. The original image (left) is an Atmos Clock. To get the image on the right, Rich used PS Elements 12 to remove the white base, replaced the background with a sky shot taken at Grand Teton National Park, touched up the clock face with Bandaid, Copy/Paste and others, and used Contrast & Brightness in numerous places on the clock face.



## SHOWN AT THE AUGUST MEETING



This is a *Before & After* pair by Rich Bickham, called *Last Tree Standing*. The original image (above) was taken on the Gulf Coast of Florida. To get the image on the right, Rich used PS Elements 12 with cropping, selecting the sky and blowing it out to white, converting to Black & White (with the infrared option), then inverting the color.







This Before & After pair is An Old Barn, shown by Judy Jorgensen.

Judy said: "I love old barns like this. I never go onto someone's property so I took the picture from the road toward the sun and, of course, got a really good shot of power lines.

There was nothing recoverable in the sky, so once I had lightened the image, I decided to replace that sky with one in my own collection. The edited image is much easier to look at, you can see the barn better, and the sky is more interesting and completely normal."


This *Before & After* pair by Judy Jorgensen, *Large Barn with Silo* is another example of how sky can affect the image.

Judy said: "The sky the day this was taken was washed out and boring so I picked a suitable one of my own to replace it with."

Cabin On Clear Lake by Judy Jorgensen (shown below) demonstrates the image transformation by changing the sky.

The color image below left is not the source image, but similar. Judy said, "This is not the original I was looking for, but the area is the same just framing the house across the lake this

time. [The cloud photo] was taken from Haligus Road just north of Ballard Road west of Crystal Lake. I love how the program automatically put color in the water and on the trees in the foreground. I love this combination of boring subject, boring original sky, overwhelming sky all put together. I hope you like it, too.

## SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS FOR PHOTO EDITING

Notes from the presentation by Peter J. Pelke II at the August 13, 2024 meeting - this is the first of a series from this presentation. Peter Used Photoshop Elements 2024.

## **Replace Sky Method 1**

- 1. Open Landscape image with "bad" sky
- 2. Open image with better sky
- 3. In Better sky image CTRL=A to select all in image; Then CTRL=C to copy
- 4. In Landscape image=> CTRL-V paste sky over landscape
- 5. Sky Layer selected use CTRL-T (Free Transform Mode) to drag and resize clouds at top of image
- 6. Use a blending mode in the layers palette => Soft Light, Screen, Overlay, etc. choose a style
- 7. Add layer mask to Sky layer (Square with round hole)
- 8. With the layer mask area highlighted, Use a large soft brush remove sky from land areas [Black=Conceals | White Reveals}
- 9. Use backslash key (\) to show red overlay to help you find what to paint. Zoom in if necessary. Press backslash(\) again to remove the overlay
- 10. Ctrl-L to open a levels control to adjust the contrast of the sky layer
- 11. Use the opacity setting in the Layers Palette to adjust sky layer further
- 12. Flatten image and Save As to rename your file ("Filename" number)
- 13. Edit in the NIK software as well





#### Replace Sky Method 2

- 1. Open image that needs new sky
- 2. Open image with a better sky
- 3. In the mage that needs new sky: Right Click on Background layer to duplicate the layer and make a background copy
- 4. In image that needs new sky Select=> Sky
- 5. Top menu=> Select => Inverse then click on the Layer Mask Icon (square with circle) creating a layer mask of the landscape you want to keep
- 6. (And/Or) Use refine edge under Select => Refine edge, use the pink overlay and adjust selection with the brush the select in refine edge output to=> New Layer W/ Layer Mask
- 7. Go to sky image Select All then Edit=> Copy
- 8. Paste sky image into Landscape image
- 9. Move Sky Layer below Landscape Layer mask image
- 10. Resize Sky Image to correct coverage and composition and location

The first topic of discussion was about landscape photography and the "Landscape Photography Group." Members are encouraged to join the "Landscape Photography Group." # Of the Earth

### The exhibition will run through spring 2025.

Five large-scale sculptures by Polish American artist Olga Ziemska will be created exclusively for a new exhibition at The Morton Arboretum, **Of the Earth**.

The exhibition will explore the artist's expression and philosophy that, she says, "We are nature." Ziemska said that her aim is to remind people that "everything in life is derived from the same basic elements that form everything in nature, including ourselves. There is no separation." In Polish, Ziemska means "of the earth."

The artist's work will be created from reclaimed tree branches and other natural materials gathered from various locations throughout the Arboretum's 1,700 acres. "I am giving reclaimed natural materials a new life and transforming them from nature into new forms," Ziemska said.
