





AUDUBON PHOTOGRAPHY AWARDS

One of the most respected nature photography competitions in the world, the Audubon Photography Awards celebrates the beauty and diversity of birds by honoring the best photos and videos of birdlife. This year, these Awards will offer new sets of prizes for entrants on two continents—spanning the Western Hemisphere. Entrants from the United States and Canada, and from Chile and Colombia, will each be eligible for cash prizes and a chance to have their images featured in Audubon magazine.

The contest is open to photography and video submissions until March 5, 2025 at 12 p.m. (noon) U.S. Eastern Time; 11 a.m. CST; 10 a.m. MST; and 9 a.m. PST. The entry fee is \$15 per image or video for individuals in the U.S. and Canada (excluding Quebec).

The Future of CLCC

Notes from the January 14 meeting

he meeting started off with name tags as members arrived, and refreshments brought in by Gail Schulz. Obviously enjoying our chatting, the Show & Tell with the holiday theme started later than usual. There were 18 members in attendance.

Royal Pitchford has been taking videography classes at MCC and showed us his finished "The Ceramic Artist." His video was very well done, and the subject was fascinating. At MCC, Royal was allowed to visit the ceramics studio and with the support of the head of the ceramics program, was able to produce a video profile of a ceramic artist as she finished one of her works of art. He has several more video projects in mind. You can view Royal's video here:

The conversation turned to preservation of images and various scanning methods for old prints and slides.

This flowed into CACCA (Chicago Area Camera Clubs Association) competition formats and the research Kevin Getty has done since volunteering to take over Rich Bickham's duties for club competitions. The 40 or so local clubs that were under CACCA prior to Covid are down to 24 clubs. Doug Frey commented on a recent attendance at the Elgin club having only 7 people the night he was there. We are down to around 15 at each meeting from pre-pandemic attendance of about 50.

Kevin reminded us that as long as CLCC is a CACCA member, CLCC individuals can enter their competitions directly. There is online capability for watching the judging and scoring, multiple categories to enter with levels A and B, and there is no charge involved. He said it is a very interesting process to see, and the level A class entries are Chicago pro level. Worth watching. It is also possible for those who are interested in competition to also join another local club or two that are still active in CACCA competitions and enter through them.

Jeff Chemelewski, who has been entering the competitions for years, reminded us that if we have judges from other clubs come to judge our competition nights, we then are obligated to send three of our people to reciprocate.

If you still have the CACCA Guidelines for judging in your email, you may want to print it. We can then discuss our *Show & Tell* and *Before & After* more meaningfully as we strive for more improved images.

Gail Schultz will check with the Algonquin Township people to see what other days of the month are available for the room we use, just in case the second Tuesday of the month is not the best for most CLCC members.

Ernie Hagenow volunteered an interesting survey: What is the typical age of camera club members? We are 50 and older, have more free time now, and have more money now.

At the February 11 meeting, we will share images and accompanying poems with the suggested theme of *love*. CLCC member Royal Pitchford will give his presentation on images and workflow. As time allows, we will also have *Show & Tell* and *Before & After*. Gail will bring Country Donuts!!

At the March 11 meeting, there will be another theme (announced in February), and there will also be a Landscape Photography presentation by CLCC member **Jeff Chemelewski**. As time allows, we will also have *Show & Tell* and *Before & After*

CACCA CHEAT SHEET FOR SCORING

Editor's Note ~ All members of this camera club can enter the various contests sponsored by The Chicago Area Camera Clubs Association (CACCA). These are the simplified guidelines for judging images as posted on **caccaphoto.org**. They also post a much more detailed guide. It is worth reading if you'd like to participate in any of their competitions. (Note the story on page 11 about their Postcard Contest.)

As we all know from watching a camera club or CACCA competition judging, the scores are subjective and sometimes variable. A small amount of variability in the score of an image is understandable, after all photography is an art and with art there is no absolute, however for most images the variability between judge's scores should not be large.

Below I outline a "cheat sheet" to help club members understand how the scoring system is intended to be used.

Scores should range from 5 to 9 points per judge. Since there are 3 judges this means the total score will be range from 15 to 27. Recently some clubs and starting in 2023-24 CACCA will use half points for digital images.

When scoring an image, the entire image should be evaluated. Minor flaws or strengths should not unduly penalize or reward an image.

Let's start with a 6. This is often called a record shot. Basically, it is a snapshot. The subject is in focus and the exposure is correct. There is nothing interesting about the image and there is nothing wrong with it, either.

Next score to discuss is a 5. An image that receives a 5 will have a significant flaw such as the subject is out of focus, or the image is significantly under or over exposed by a stop or more. Shallow depth of field may be a flaw or may be an artistic treatment, you as judge need to decide this. Likewise, high-key and low-key images may be artistic or a flaw. Before giving an image the score of a 5, please ask yourself does this image work. If you answer yes, then the image should not receive a 5.

Stepping up from a 6, is an image with a score of 7, a stronger image. This is an image that is more than snapshot, it engages the viewer and shows that the photographer had intent.

The next score up is an 8. Images that score 8, have a wow factor. You look at the image and say to yourself, this image is good. I think it should receive an honor.

An even better image would receive a score 9. Such an image is great. Perhaps a double wow factor, or an image you wish was part of your portfolio. Images that score 9 are not perfect, just exceptionally strong images.
