

Ansel Adams Photographs - Records of the National Park Service

In 1941 the National Park Service commissioned noted photographer Ansel Adams to create a photo mural for the Department of the Interior Building in Washington, DC. The mural project was halted because of World War II and never resumed, however the photographs remained. In 1962, the photographs were accessioned into the holdings of the Still Picture Branch at the National Archives and Records Administration. This is a catalogue of these images with unrestricted digital access.
